
The MHAS celebrated 20 years of follow-up

- Completed 6 waves from 2001 to 2021
- Public release of wave 6 (2021) in July 2023
- Emphasis on facilitating use of the data
 - 7th annual meeting of MHAS users in 2022
 - 5th, 6th and 7th have been Virtual.
 - Special Volume with MHAS papers to be published in Fall 2023






Publications using MHAS data until July 2023 (total 385)

Participants in MHAS by number of interviews 2001 to 2021



Rising Trend of Obesity through the Panel Years


Rising Trends of Diabetes for Men & Women, Young & Old Older Adults

Complete Interviews* by Wave and Age




* Direct and proxy interviews

NOTE: The sample cohorts are older with time. In 2001, 53% of the sample was 60+. In 2021, 69% of the sample was 60+.




Structural Reforms and Macro Shocks through the MHAS Panel



Biomarkers and Cognitive Aging in Sub-Samples

- Anthropometrics and performance measures
- Venous Blood & Saliva Samples
 - DNA (GWAS ~7,200, APOE ~8,600, Ancestry ~7,200, Sequencing ~6,000)
 - NIAGADS repository or study website
- Hair Samples
 - Heavy metals exposure ~2,600
- HCAP in Mexico (Mex-Cog)
 - > Wave **1** (2016) and Wave **2** (2021) public data



Data Linkages at Community Level

- Historical Series
- Census data; Public health infrastructure
- Birth and death records;COVID-19 cases, deaths, and hospitalizations
- Administrative records of main social insurance programs (Seguro Popular, *PROGRESA*, 70+)
- Air pollution (PM10, PM2.5, Ozone, NO2)
- Extreme temperatures, drought, and natural disasters



Plans for MHAS 2024 and 2027

- Wave 7 planned for 2024, Wave 8 in 2027
- Add refresher sample in 2024 with a rural over-sample
- Wave 3 of Mex-Cog in 2025
- New content proposed:
 - Perceived discrimination
 - Use of multiple languages (indigenous, English)
 - Use of mobile device technology for health care
 - Long COVID
- Remote enclave in Mexico (INEGI)
