

LSAHA – Design

- Sample N=3,000 adults aged
 <u>></u> 60 years from two areas in Lebanon, selected to provide a diverse and "representative" sample of older adults in Lebanon
- 2. Administer comprehensive health and social survey, anthropometric measures, physical performance tests and HCAP cognitive test battery
- 3. Collect blood samples
- 4. Start data collection: October 9, 2023!







In general, would you say your health is excellent, very good, good, fair, or poor?




How would you rate your memory at the present time? Would you say it is excellent, very good, good, fair, or poor?




